



vrose was singing a song when the earthquake hit. "While finishing a verse, that's when I heard shatters and shaking. My mom was in front of a door, and then she fell."

After making sure her mother was okay, Yvrose ran for help. Her home was destroyed and she could quickly see the damage the 7.2 magnitude earthquake had done around her.

"I believe that my house would have collapsed anyways because other houses that have better foundations collapsed," she said.

Yvrose didn't yet know that more than 137,000 homes like hers had been destroyed, in addition to the loss of schools, hospitals, and key infrastructure across Haiti. She was also lucky to be alive as more than 2,200 lost their lives.

"The message I'd like to share is to say that I am happy that He sent many people to me to share their ideas with me and to help me see how to move on with life," said Yvrose. "God sent me ADRA to help me in this situation."

efore the war in Yemen escalated, Ahmed owned a small farm. He didn't make much money, but he lived in peace and supported his wife and five children.

When conflict forced the family to flee, they ran with nothing but the clothes on their backs. Ahmed continued to find work to support his family, even as his wife fell ill.

At their second displacement camp, Ahmed joined ADRA's SAWA III cash-for-work project, which was completed in 2021.

"For once, fortune was on my side," he said.

Through this, Ahmed was able to pay off most of his debts and send his kids back to school. He was overwhelmed with happiness and began making plans for the future.

"I just couldn't believe it, that I would be able to make money again," he told us. He paused for a while before adding, "This chance could help me restore my livelihood."

a Phaw was concerned about his daughter's health. The girl was small for her age and suffered from skin rashes.

When he joined ADRA's EMBRACE project, Ma Phaw was taught how to grow healthy foods at home. He learned how to prepare soil, make natural fertilizer, and plant seeds. He also learned about the nutritional values of the vegetables he was growing and the importance of a healthy diet.

Now, Ma Phaw and his family gather organic vegetables from their own kitchen garden every day.

"We have been on the new diet for six months, and have seen a real improvement," said Ma Phaw when we spoke with him. "My little girl has gained weight, she is more active and no longer gets the skin rashes she used to."

The EMBRACE project, which concluded in 2021, was funded by ADRA in Canada and partners and improved maternal and early childhood health in rural areas across Cambodia, Myanmar, Rwanda, and the Philippines.

# Wins for Education U

A child should not miss out on school, *period*. A child also shouldn't miss out on school *because of* their period.


In Zambia, ADRA provided a solution for girls who were missing school because they lacked vital supplies for their monthly periods by introducing them to reusable sanitary pads and training them how to make them for themselves.

"I don't abscond from school anymore," said 15-year-old Alice. "I feel comfortable and safe by using this reusable sanitary pad. ADRA has also taught me how to sew them."

This was part of the WASH Integrating Nutrition in Schools (WINS) project, which was completed in 2021. In addition to reusable pads for the girls, more than 5,000 people now have access to safe water after ADRA drilled and set up solarpowered water systems. And schools are benefitting from modern toilet facilities and gardens that provide produce for student meals, as well as income when there are surplus crops that can be sold to the community.

Partnering in a Pandemic 🖸

n April 2021, a deadly surge of COVID-19 cases swept across South Asia. Medical systems in the affected countries were overwhelmed and lacked critical resources to save lives and prevent further spread of the virus.

ADRA partnered with Seventh-day Adventist medical facilities and others in a swift response that delivered vital equipment and support.

In India, one major concern was the lack of oxygen available for hospitals. ADRA was able to source oxygen generation plants (OGPs) to provide medical-grade oxygen for entire facilities, as well as air-purifying HEPA filters, and many more urgently needed resources and personal protective equipment.

While this commitment began in 2021, the work is ongoing. At this time, OGPs have been delivered to seven hospitals and HEPA filters to eight!
